

Announcing the publication of *Political Philosophy in the Twentieth Century*, ed. Catherine H. Zuckert (Cambridge, 2011), 280 pp. \$29.95 paper. Inspired by Ellis Sandoz’s description of the way in which Eric Voegelin’s life reflected his understanding of “the philosopher’s vocation,” Catherine Zuckert has collected accounts of the ways in which the lives and thought of seventeen other prominent political philosophers constituted responses to the unprecedented political crises of the twentieth century. Voegelin is featured as one of several European emigrés who fundamentally changed American political discourse by making it more philosophical and historical.
