Director's Note

The past two years have been incredibly difficult for the arts community, like many others. On March 12, 2020 Broadway went dark for the first time since September 11th. It remained shuttered for 16 months. In that time-span regional, community, and academic theatre programs across the country followed suit, sacrificing the ability to create art in order to combat an international health crisis. Now, two years later, I am so exited to be returning to work.

[title of show] is a celebration of theatre and more importantly, friendship. The story of our characters, Jeff, Hunter, Heidi, and Susan mobilizing their passion for theatre and their love for performing to compose an original musical resonates well with our student's excitement to return to the stage. Our show is a love letter to those students. We celebrate every artist, actor, designer, and musician who are striving to overcome their anxieties and insecurities as we bring live performance back into the world.

Beyond the practical tones of theatre and creation present in [title of show], its social significance finds resonance. Many of us spent a large portion of the pandemic in our homes, often removed from those we love. For our students, the inability to meet face-to-face limited their opportunities to make friends and establish a community. As these pandemic restrictions have been lifted, the social anxieties of returning to public life have been challenging for many. The world has become strange and unfamiliar, with these changes comes significant insecurity. As Heidi says in our show, "we've all got the insecurities."

As a final thought, I'd like to point towards one of my favorite lyrics from our show.

"We can either follow our instincts
Or take advice from every joker
We can either be distinct
Or wind up merely mediocre"

As we each begin to re-enter the world, I urge you to be distinct. Be weird. Be wacky. Be you. In turn, take the time to celebrate the diversity around you. This is our chance to rebuild our communities, to support each other, and to celebrate the distinctions that make us each unique and vital.
