Director's Notes

Welcome back to LSU theatre! This is only the second show (the first was just a few weeks ago) to be performed in-person here at LSU since the pandemic shut down most our productions in Spring 2020. Our students, production folks, and I have been waiting for a long time to put up this show which was announced in Spring 2020. While all of us have waited for this show with eager anticipation it has been an experience of fits and starts. We're out of practice, the routines have gotten foggy, and commitments have shifted with our ongoing crises. That said, this show and the people involved in it have been a buoy for me throughout. I have never looked forward to rehearsals, never enjoyed watching bonds formed, never come home each night with a light inside my soul as much as I have in this rehearsal process. Welcome back, folks. It's game time.

It is no accident that the show that has created this intense sense of belonging is about soccer. I give talks regularly about the similarities between sports and theatre; the parallels between players and actors, coaches and directors, fields and stages. Both theatre and sports are also foundational community-building events and we certainly see that at play here. Through the pleasures and pains of of high school, these soccer players rely on the routines, banter, and care of their teammates to get them through everything from term papers on Armenia and feminine hygiene product choices to eating disorders and grief. Regardless of their in-process identities and social status off the field, on the field they and their teammates and the game are known and comforting quantities. Spaces like these often allow people to find the truest versions of themselves -selves that have been marginalized elsewhere - in

the warmth of belonging. Theatre is often the place where people who have difficulty belonging in more traditional spaces find their family, too. That belonging also carries risk. What happens when the only place you feel your truest self, the strongest sense of belonging, becomes inaccessible or toxic? Which is why so many people have such strong feelings about sports and theatre: the stakes of belonging or not belonging are so high when you feel ostracized elsewhere.

But in the end, The Wolves suggests, that risk and the investment it involves is worth it. When crisis strikes, the team comes together to find solace, laughter, and normalcy. At times throughout this production process rehearsals have felt like a sanctuary of focus, play, reflection and even escape from the din of disasters in our collective worlds. That space of temporary but regular refuge and community has brought hope that those things will make their way more regularly into more of our spaces soon.

We hope you enjoy the show!
