History of Constitution Day

The constitution of the United States of America was signed on September 17, 1787. September 17th now is a national holiday known as Constitution Day after the passage of a Senate Resolution introduced by Senator Robert Byrd of West Virginia. Senator Byrd believes that students lack significant knowledge regarding the United States Constitution and proposed this amendment in an attempt to increase students' understanding of the constitution.
