

SPANISH CLASS SCHEDULING QUESTIONS

I tried to schedule SPAN 1101 and received a message to contact Foreign Languages. Why can't I schedule this class?

Spanish 1101 is designed for students who have one year or less of high school Spanish. Students with two or more years of high school Spanish should begin with Spanish 1152.

If you took one year of high school Spanish and unsuccessfully tried to schedule SPAN 1101 or took two years of high school Spanish and couldn't schedule SPAN 1152, you'll need to see the Spanish advisor for assistance. The Spanish advisor for the Spring 2017 semester is Mr. Sheldon Lotten. His advising hours are Monday/Wednesday 8:30-10:00am and Friday 9:00-10:00am in Room 350 Hodges Hall. There is no need for an appointment if you're coming to Mr. Lotten's office during his office hours. If you aren't able to see Mr. Lotten during his advising hours, contact him at slotte1@lsu.edu for an appointment.

Do I have to take the Spanish placement test to schedule Spanish?

No. While it is strongly recommended that students take the exam, it is not a requirement to schedule lower level Spanish. Students who still want to take the placement test may test out of SPAN 1101, 1102, 2101, and 2102. There is no placement test for SPAN 1152 or upper level Spanish.

Students who wish to take the placement test can come to the Department of Foreign Languages & Literatures, 316 Hodges Hall, to complete the permission form and pick up testing times/days/instructions.

If you took the placement test and are qualified to schedule SPAN 1101, 1102, 1152, 2101, 2102 *but couldn't schedule the class*, you'll need to visit with Advisor Sheldon Lotten for assistance.

Do I receive credit for SPAN 1101 if I pass SPAN 1152?

If a student passes SPAN 1152 with a "C" or better, the student is awarded credit for *SPAN 1101*. Not a grade – just four hours of credit.
