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The LSU Post-Katrina Community Recovery Survey

It has been five years since Hurricane Katrina struck Greater New Orleans. Our community and church leaders are partnering with the LSU Sociology Department in Baton Rouge to help us take stock of what we've gone through, what we've accomplished, and what challenges remain ahead.

We ask you to participate in a survey about our community. We want to understand what community members need for their recovery, what the community needs for its overall recovery, how community leaders can help, and what these things mean for the future of our community.

We know your time is valuable. We ask for your participation only because we think it will help guide our community's recovery. The survey takes an average of 20 minutes to complete (some people will do it faster, some slower). This survey has now been done by over 6,000 community members and has been used by over 200 communities in their recovery planning.

This survey will be used only for community recovery planning and scholarly research. We are not doing any fund raising or selling anything. All your answers are completely confidential, and you are free to skip any question or to end the survey at any point. We share results only in aggregate, percentaged form. We do not release data with personally identifying information. If you have questions about this survey, you may contact the LSU Sociology Department.

Please ask *each* adult in your household (age 18 and over) to also take the survey: each person should fill out a separate form.

Even if you are not returning, please participate for the sake of your family, friends, and neighbors who do want to come home and rebuild our community.

What can we learn from this survey?

How will this survey help our community and our leaders understand what efforts are most effective for recovery and community development?

The survey tries to put usable information into the hands of leaders, who can apply the knowledge to help the community. It tries to answer questions like these:

- How much damage did people sustain? What will it take to recover? Do people consider it worth it? Are they willing? What do they plan to do?
 - Where will they look for resources for recovery?
 - How important is social or community support, as compared to material resources?
- Who is staying, who is leaving, and why?
 - Is it jobs? Destruction and loss? Family connections? Strength of the community?
 - Do people feel safe and protected from future storms? Are they getting accurate information for their safety?
- What can leaders do to help people return and rebuild aside from obtaining more money and resources for the community?
 - How can leaders promote community cooperation to stretch resources and help recovery? How can leaders make people feel more included?
 - How much have people already worked together during the aftermath and the recovery? What can leaders do to promote this?
 - How important is it to provide events & programs for the community?
 - Do people feel that the disasters have created more closeness or more conflict in the community, and what can be done to help?
- What have the disasters meant to to people emotionally and spiritually?
 - Have the disasters produced more fear, anger, and depression, or more optimism, hope, and resolve to repair what is wrong?
 - What can leaders do to help people with their difficult feelings?
 - Have the disasters challenged and/or reinforced peoples' faith?
 - Do people feel secure that others both within and outside the region would help them, or do they feel abandoned?
- Whom do people praise and blame?
 - Do they feel national leaders have done a good or bad job? State leaders? Local leaders? Community and church leaders?
 - Whom do people look to for help and support?
 - What should leaders do to hear community needs most clearly, and address them?
