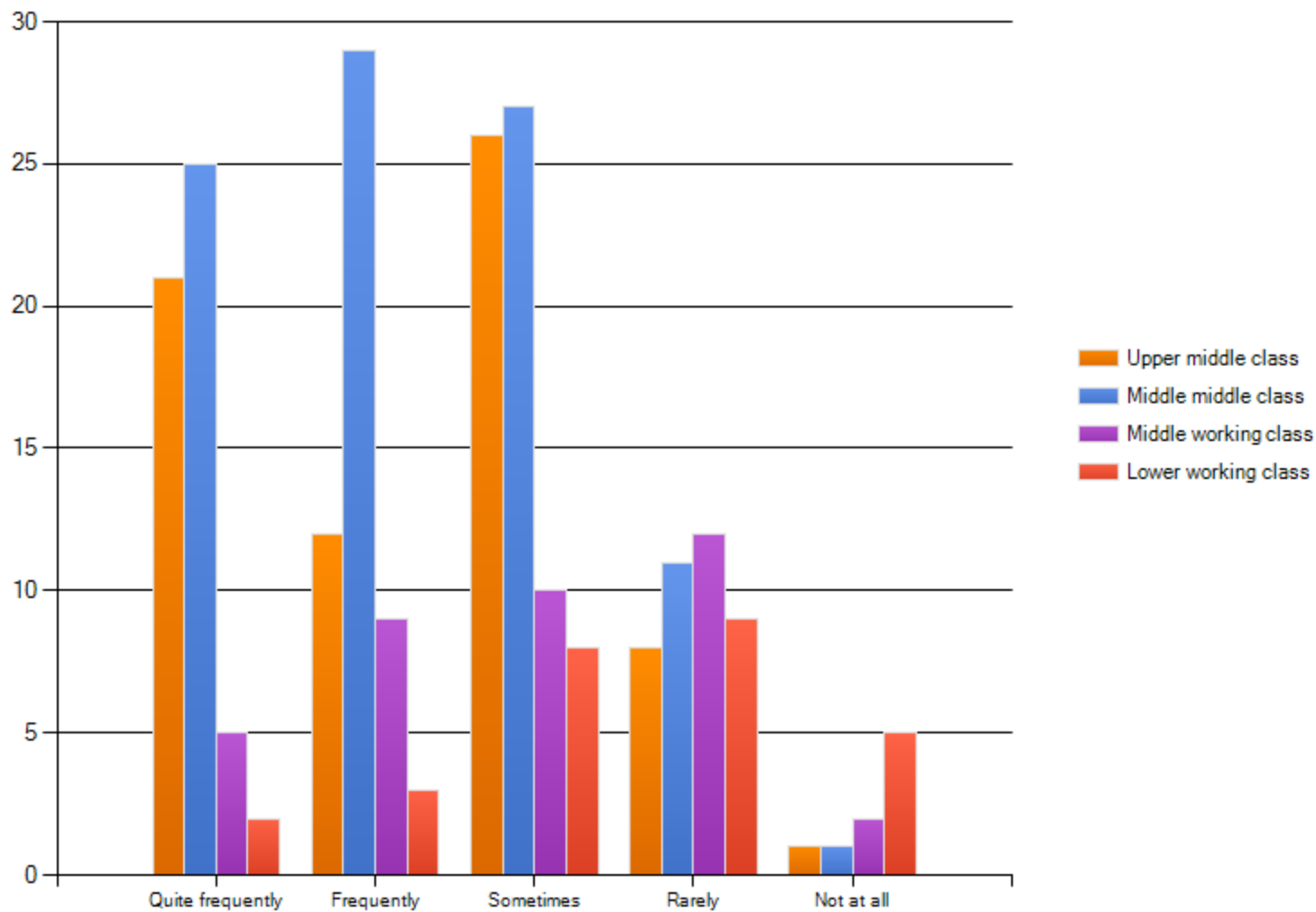


Social Class & Political Discussion

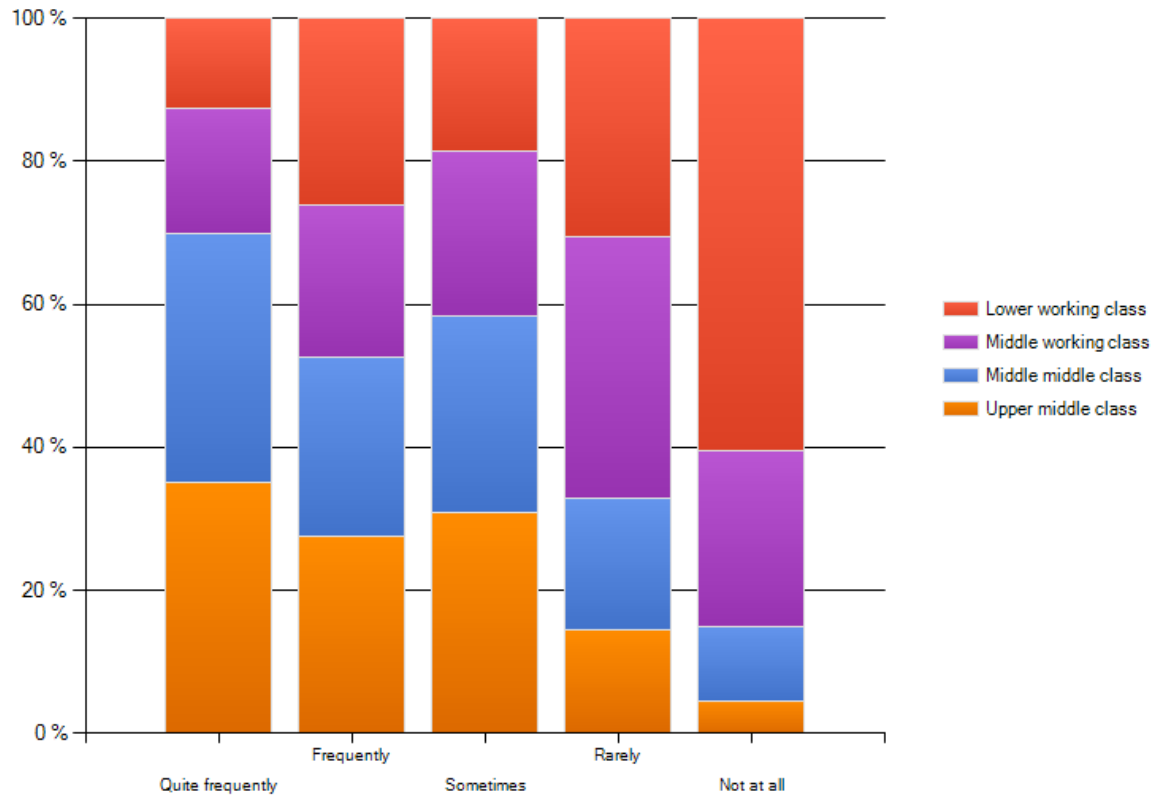
- Total Responses: N=317

How frequently did the adults in your social group—your parents, friends of your parents, and your neighbors—discuss political issues?



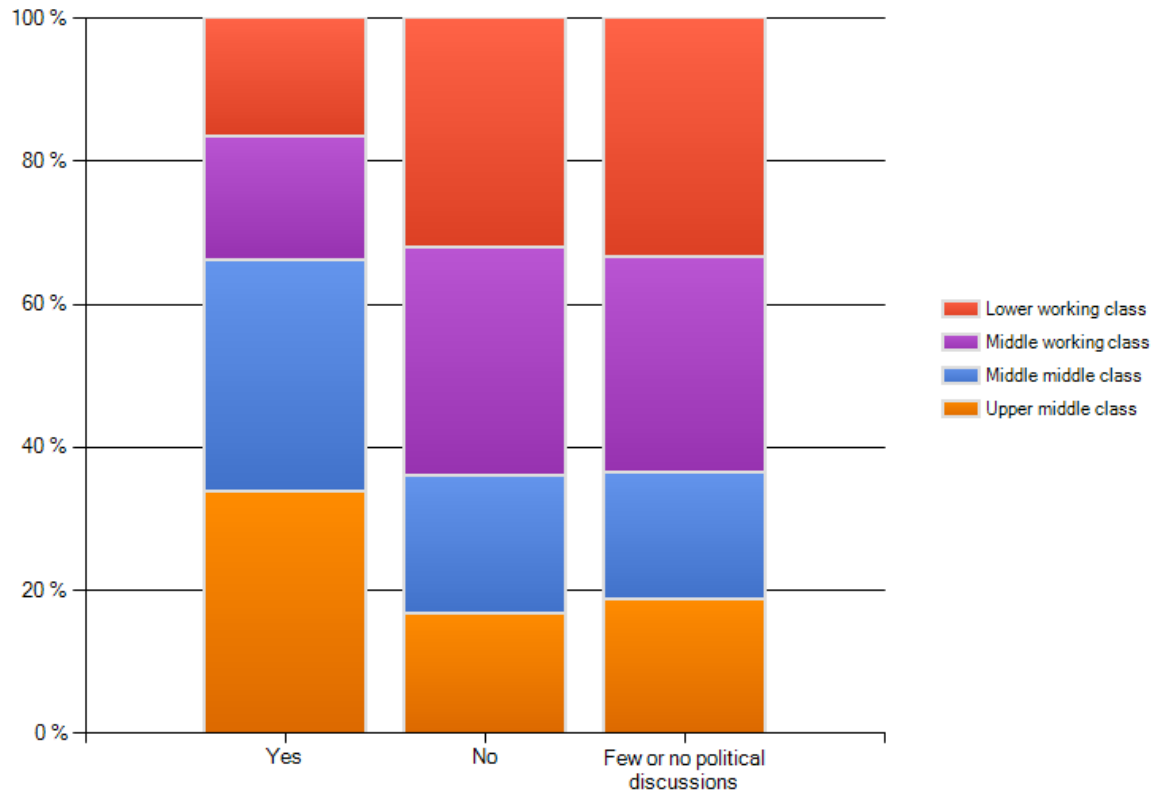
Frequency at Home (excluding lower middle, upper lower)

How frequently did your parents discuss political issues in the home?



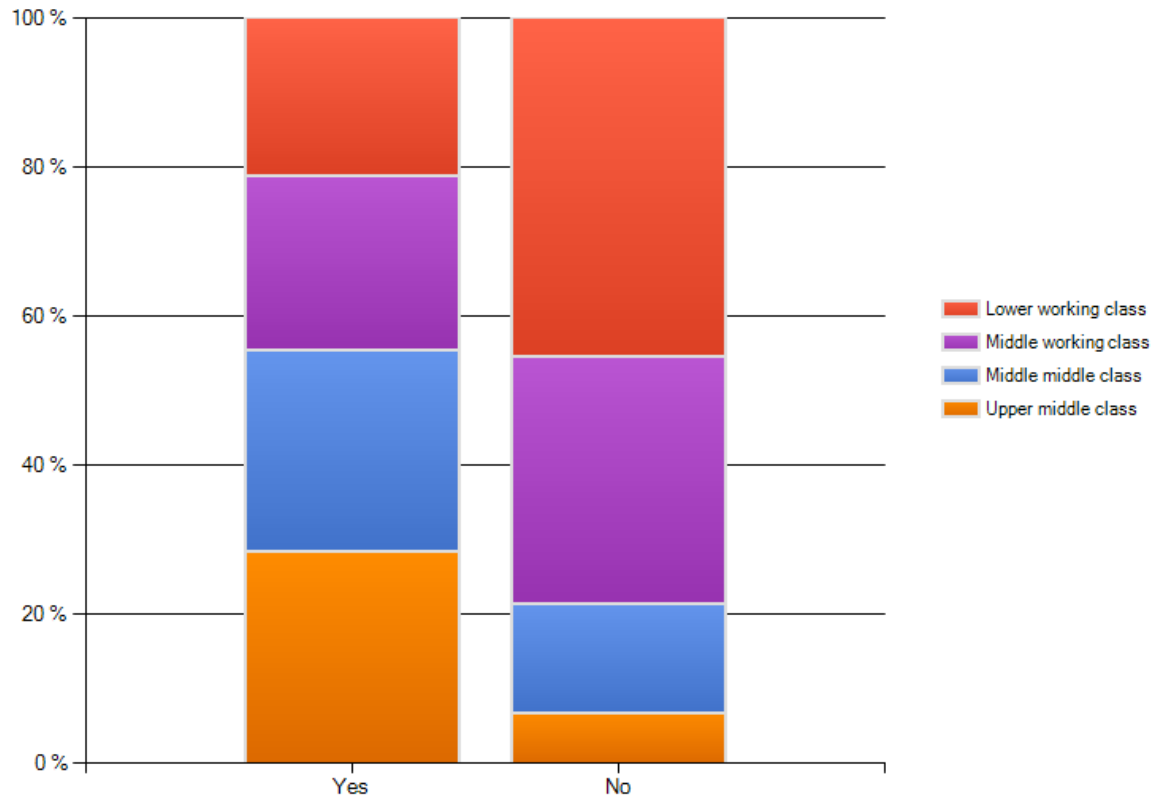
Political Discussion at Home (excluding lower middle, upper lower)

If there were political discussion in your home, were children encouraged to participate?



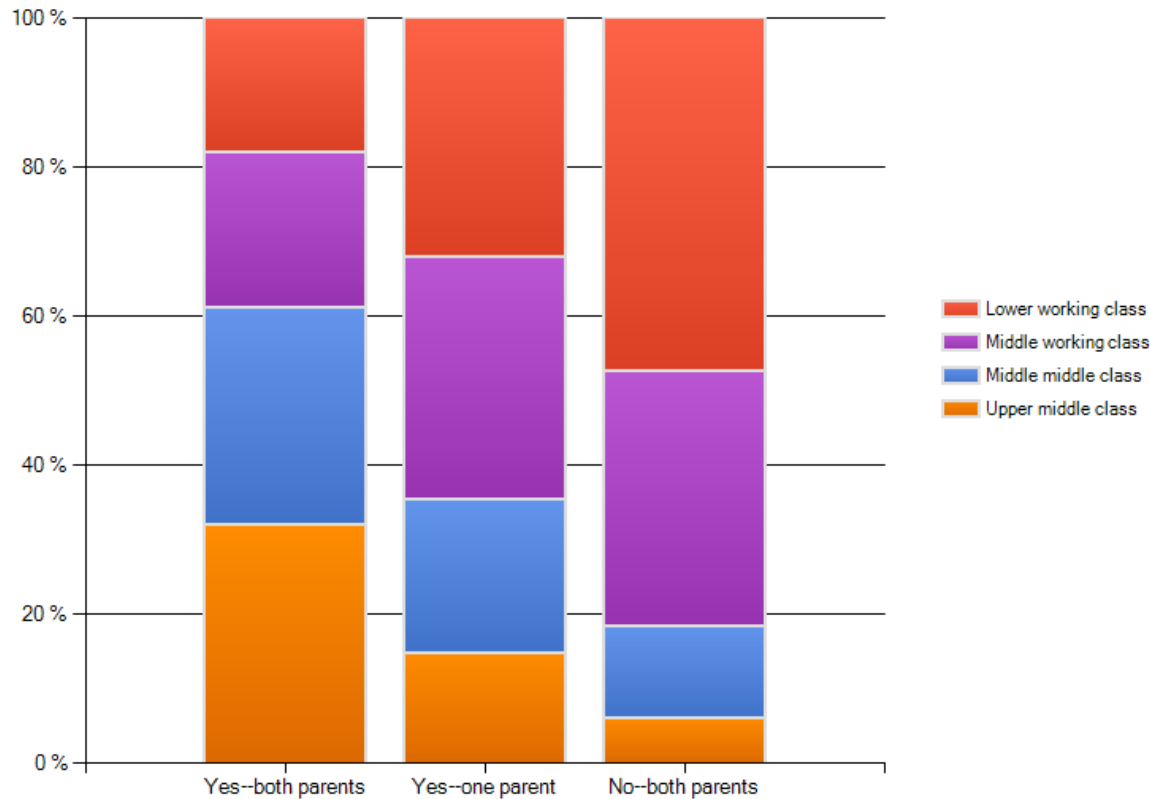
Parents Belong (excluding lower middle, upper lower)

Did you know to which political party your parents belonged or preferred?



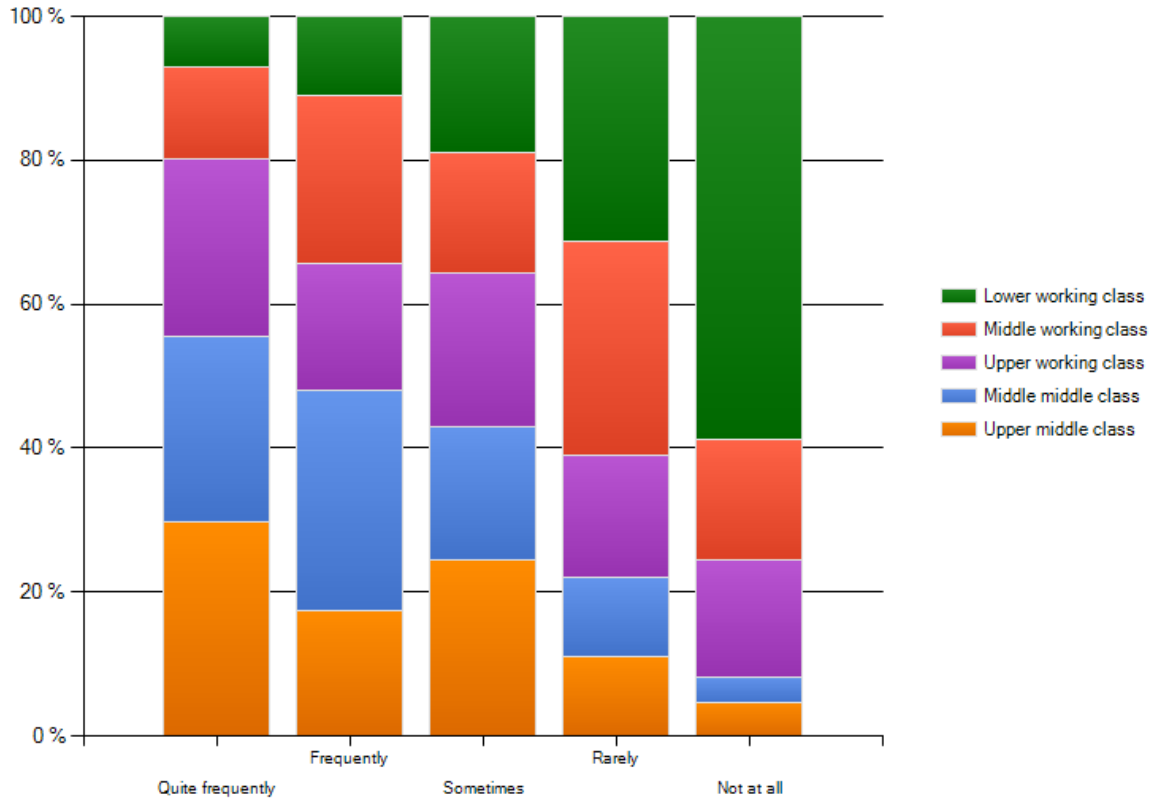
Parents Voting (excluding lower middle, upper lower)

Did you know how your parents voted, for example, in presidential elections?

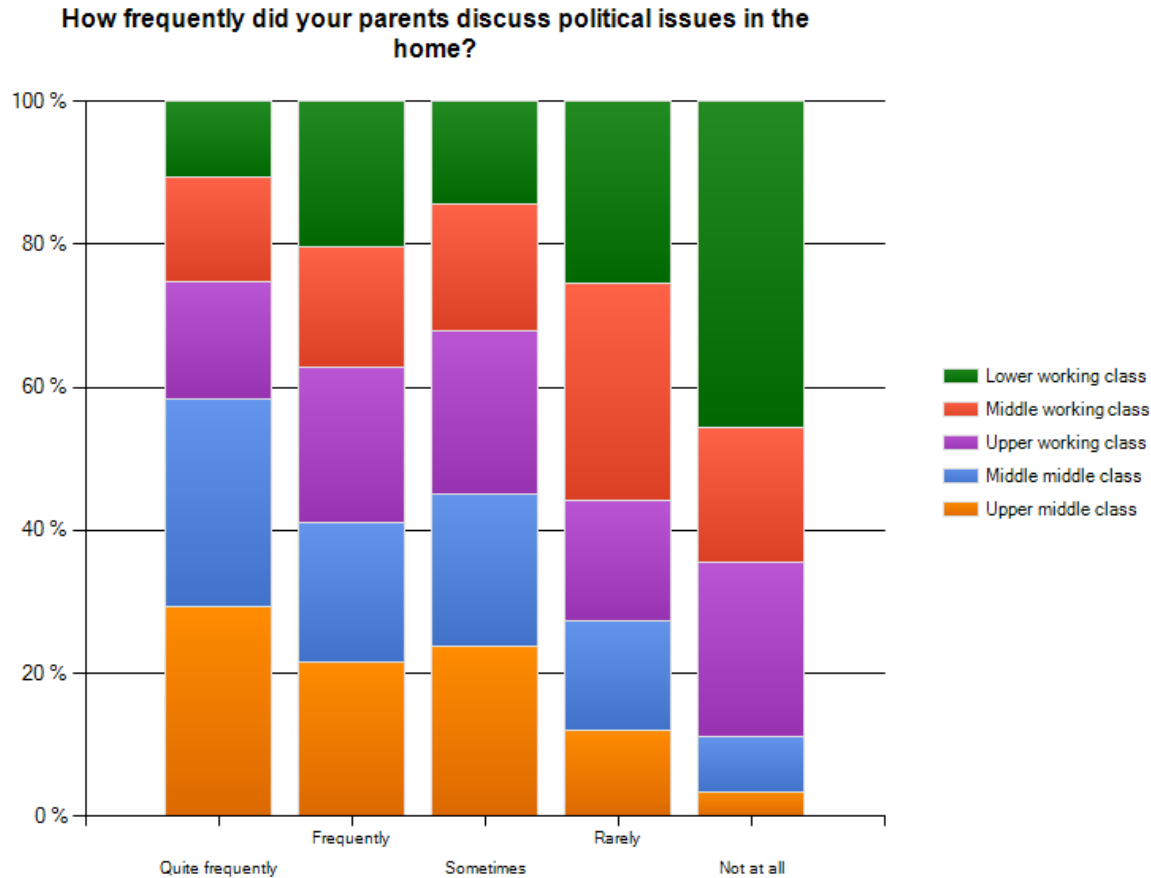


Frequency Social Group (excluding lower middle)

How frequently did the adults in your social group—your parents, friends of your parents, and your neighbors—discuss political issues?

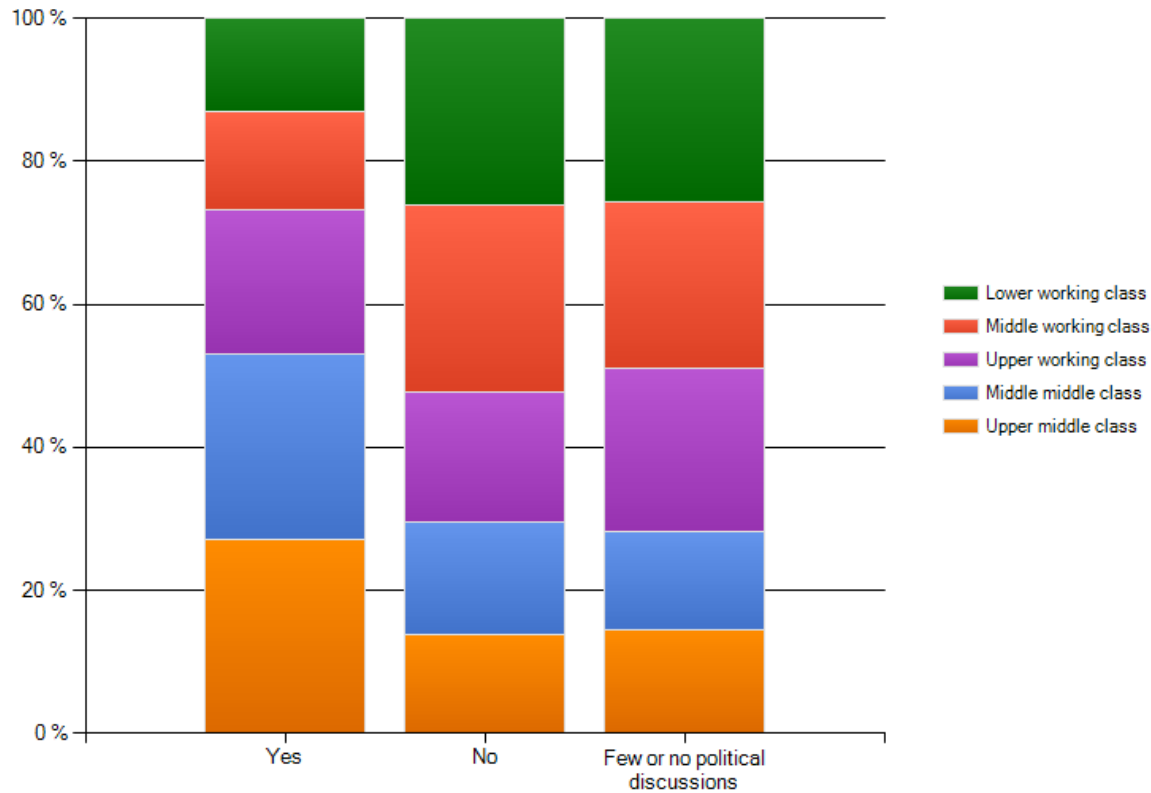


Political Issues at Home (excluding lower middle)

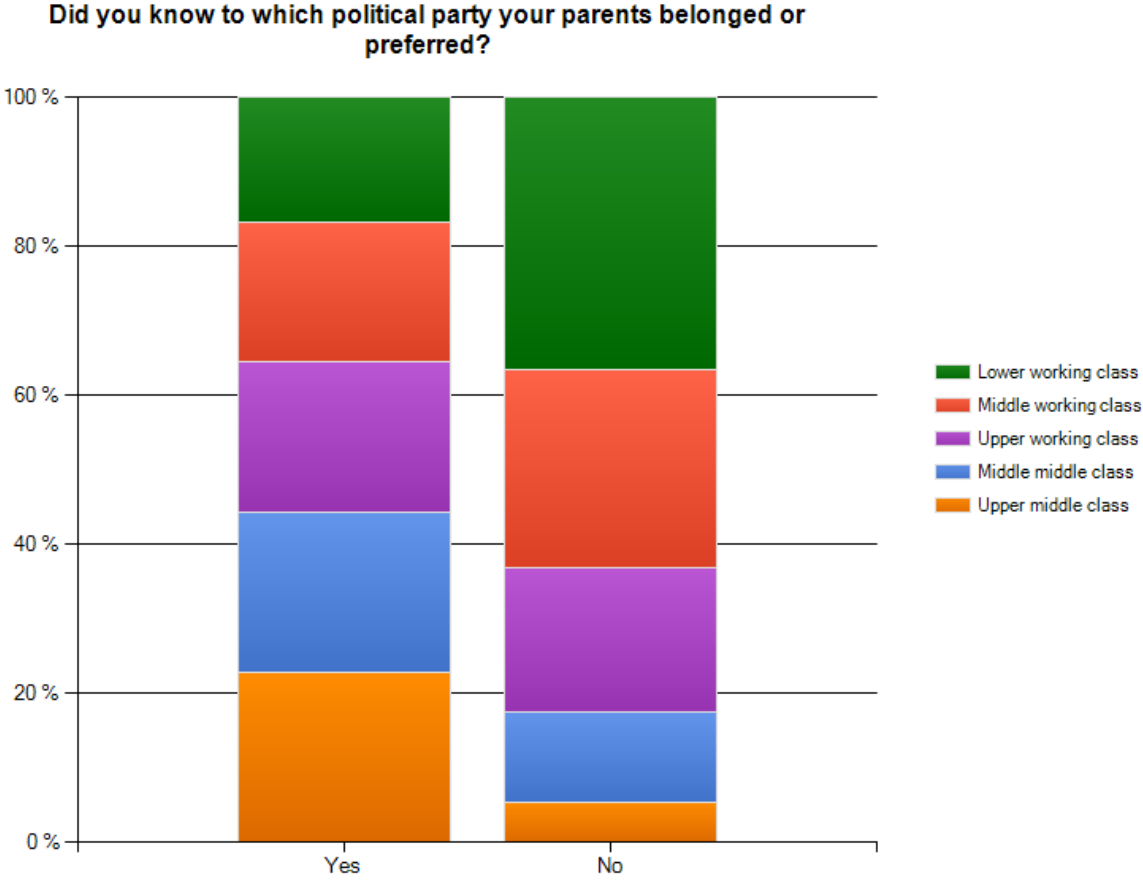


Children Participation (excluding lower middle)

If there were political discussion in your home, were children encouraged to participate?

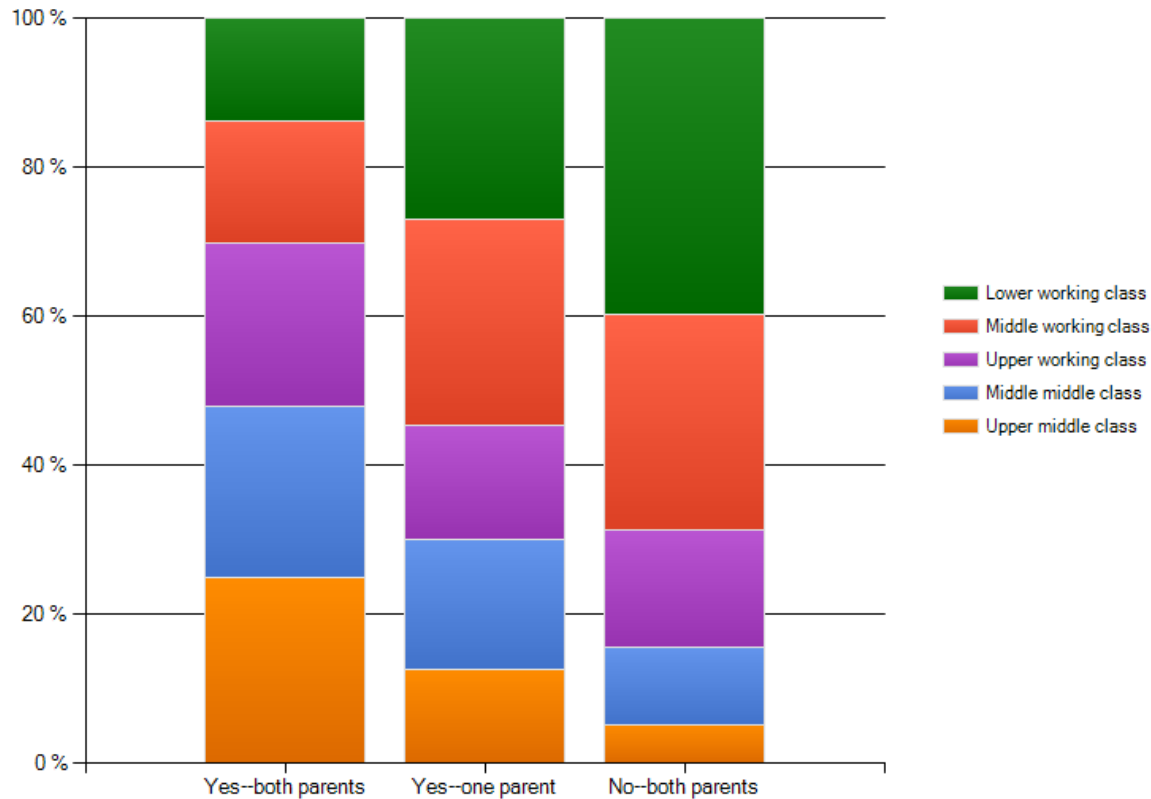


Party Parents Belonged (excluding lower middle)
