

# **DID YOU KNOW?**

- The LSU Tiger Marching Band recently received a Grammy nomination for a collaboration with zydeco musician and LSU alumnus Sean Ardoin. It marks the first time a marching band and a popular genre band have collaborated for a full album.
- In fall 2022, LSU once again welcomed its largest and most accomplished freshman class in university history, with an all-time high median GPA at 3.78 and an ACT composite of 25.5.
- LSU is in the elite 1 percent of U.S. universities having land-, sea-, and space-grant designations.
- LSU is one of only eight universities in the nation with dental, law, veterinary, medical, and elite MBA programs.
- In 2022, LSU was designated as a Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Operations by the National Security Agency. It's an honor shared with only 21 other universities and colleges in the nation.
- LSU is ranked among the top 100 universities in the world granted U.S. utility patents.
- LSU's School of Veterinary Medicine is one of only 35
   accredited colleges of veterinary medicine in the U.S.
   and Canada. The graduate program excels in research
   on equine health, vector-borne diseases, respiratory
   diseases, and molecular medicine and imaging.
- The LSU Center for Academic Success has been designated as one of only three Learning Centers of Excellence by the National College Learning Center Association.


