Notes:

In Fall 1994, Mass Communication moved from College of Arts and Sciences to Manship School of Mass Communication.

In Fall 1999, Theatre was moved from College of Arts and Sciences to College of Music & Dramatic Arts.

In Fall 2000, Junior Division was renamed University College (U.C.) Center for Freshman Year. Prior Junior Division Enrollment is shown in the new College.

Also, General College was renamed University College (U.C.) Center for Advising & Counseling. Prior General College enrollment is shown in the new College.

In Fall 2004 University College Evening School was renamed Evening School.

In the Fall 2005 semester, LSU enrolled 2,700 visting students whose college or university was impacted by Hurricane Katrina. These students are not included in this report.

In Fall 2008 School of Coast and Environment began enrolling undergraduates in Coastal Environmental Science.

In Fall 2010 the College of Arts and Sciences was renamed to College of Humanities and Social Sciences. Also, the College of Basic Sciences was renamed to College of Science.

In Fall 2012, the College of Education was merged with School of Social Work, School of Library and Information Sciences, and Human Resource Education, Child and Family Sciences,

and Business Education from the College of Agriculture. The newly formed college was renamed Human Sciences and Education.

Additionally, Computer Science moved from the College of Science to the College of Engineering.

New freshmen were admitted directly to the following senior colleges: Agriculture (1995), Music & Dramatic Arts (2005), & Business Administration (2006).
