



## LSU Summer Music Camp June 12-16, 2022

### FAQs

#### **Meals:**

- Lunch and Dinner provided for residential and commuter participants – breakfast is only provided for residents. You will receive a badge to cover breakfast (residents only), lunch, and dinner each day in the 459 Dining Hall or the Faculty Dining Hall (check schedule for detailed locations). Snacks and any additional food purchases are the responsibility of the camper.

#### **Facilities:**

- Camp activities will primarily occur in two buildings: the College of Music & Dramatic Arts Building (CMDA) and the School of Music Building (SoM). Both are air-conditioned and have restrooms & water fountains available. A sweater or light jacket is recommended as the temperature inside often fluctuates.

#### **Auditions:**

- Students should plan on bringing a short etude or piece to play ( no more than 5 minutes) for each other during the opening sectional time on Sunday evening akin to what you would perform for a solo and ensemble type event that shows off your musical abilities. This will serve as your audition for part assignments and chamber ensemble placement and will also be a great opportunity for you to receive feedback from our terrific faculty and graduate students.

#### **Medical Forms**

- All medical forms are being captured within the Active system when students register for camp. This must be completed prior the beginning of camp. You do not need to bring any medical form with you to registration.

#### **Illness & Injury:**

- In the event of an illness or injury, campers should notify a counselor or staff member immediately. Students will be accompanied to the University Student Health Center, located adjacent to the College of Music & Dramatic Arts Building. Students with minor injury or illness may be assigned to their rooms for rest. Students with major injury or illness will be sent home. The band staff reserves the right to exercise judgement about whether a sick camper can remain at camp. Students may be sent home for their own health and the safety of the other campers.

#### **Student Health Center:**

- Located adjacent to the Music & Dramatic Arts Building on Infirmery Rd, the Student Health Center will be available to treat minor injuries and illnesses. Local 911 services will be called for emergencies. Major illnesses/injuries will be referred to local hospitals. The Center is “out-of-network” but will accept health insurance. Upon check-in, a visit fee will be charged. Campers must have a signed medical release form on file with the camp staff.

### **COVID-19 Protocols:**

- LSU is currently not requiring any additional COVID-19 protocols beyond what is recommended by the Governor, Louisiana Department of Health, and the CDC. Students are welcome to wear masks, but they are not currently required to be worn in campus facilities. If anyone becomes ill, we will follow the current University and CDC protocols. ### **Student Recital:**

- Students interested in potentially performing on the student recital Wednesday evening should bring a prepared piece with the piano accompaniment (if available). ### **Parking:**

- Monday through Thursday permit parking for commuters (and residents leaving their vehicles) will be in assigned parking in a specific lot (more details later). Parking on campus is not enforced on Sundays. A permit is required for parking on campus. To secure a parking pass or if you have any questions, contact Kara Duplantier at (225) 578-2384. Parking zones are in effect until 8:00 pm Monday through Friday.

### **Commuter Pick-up/Drop-Off:**

- Non-parking commuters being driven by a family member/friend may be dropped off and picked up at the School of Music (except on Sunday). Please consult the campus map online for an electronic version.
  - Note: Drop-off on Sunday is at Acadian Hall and Pick-up on Sunday evening will be at Tiger Band Hall
- Camp activities typically end by 8:30pm each evening. A counselor will escort students to the pick-up location at the end of the day. Consult the schedule included for detailed times.
