She has authored, been the lead author and contributed to numerous documents around climate change including all four of the US National Climate Assessments (most recent released in November 2018). With the US Global Change Research Program, she became the Regional Liaison to all of the 20 regions for the 1st *U.S. National Assessment of the Potential Consequences of Climate Variability and Change*. Among many other climate change related efforts, she has testified before a US Senate Committee on climate change program issues, participated as an advisor to many organizations and boards, developed and taught semester long and short courses on climate change issues for both formal education (teaching faculty and college students) and informally for the interested public and informal educators (e.g. museums, nature centers, etc.), including the *Public Understanding of Science* as an invited teaching fellow at the Environmental Change Institute at Oxford University.
