


Student and Faculty Outreach

Enrollment Breakdown

With 29,292 total students enrolled in Spring 2017, Louisiana State University has its eighth-largest Spring class ever. The highest in LSU history was 29,974 in Spring 2005. As seen in Figure 1, 13,810 (47%) of the students are male and 15,482 (53%) are female, an 8% and 13% increase respectively in the ten-year period since Spring 2008. LSU's Spring 2017 minority enrollment (Figure 2) has increased 25% since Spring 2013, and now includes 3,481 Black students (a 1% increase from Spring 2016 and a 21% increase from Spring 2013), 1,726 Hispanic students (a 3% increase from Spring 2016 and a 36% increase from Spring 2013), and 111 American Indian/Alaskan Native & Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander students (a 4% decrease from Spring 2016 and a 9% increase from Spring 2013). Enrollment by level (Figure 3) shows that LSU has 24,089 Undergraduates (a 0.4% decrease from Spring 2016 and 6% increase from Spring 2013), 4,234 Graduates (a 0.2% increase from Spring 2016 and a 2% decrease from Spring 2013), and 969 Professionals (a 3% increase from Spring 2016 and an 8% decrease from Spring 2013).
