A RESOLUTION

TO RECOMMEND TO THE LSU DEPARTMENT OF RESIDENTIAL LIFE THAT A NEW POLICY OF 24-HOUR WEEKEND VISITATION BE ADOPTED IN UNIVERSITY RESIDENCE HALLS.

- PARAGRAPH 1:** WHEREAS, STUDENTS THAT LIVE ON CAMPUS ARE CONSUMERS WHO DEMAND AND DESERVE SERVICES THAT ACCOMMODATE THEIR DIVERSE LIFESTYLES.
- PARAGRAPH 2:** WHEREAS, THE CURRENT OUTDATED POLICY PERMITS A GUEST (OF THE OPPOSITE SEX) TO VISIT A RESIDENT UNTIL 3:00AM DURING THE WEEKEND.
- PARAGRAPH 3:** WHEREAS, THE NEW POLICY WOULD BE AS FOLLOWS:
"24 HOUR WEEKEND VISITATION BEGINS ON FRIDAY AT 10:00AM AND ENDS AT 1:00AM ON MONDAY. GUESTS MUST PROVIDE PICTURE IDENTIFICATION AND SIGN IN AS AN OVERNIGHT GUEST IN ORDER TO BE GIVEN AN OVERNIGHT PASS. THE GUEST MUST BE ESCORTED BY HIS OR HER HOST OR HOSTESS AT ALL TIMES. THE SAME POLICY APPLIES IN MALE AND FEMALE HALLS. 'VISITATION' REFERS TO PERIODIC VISITS OF A GUEST OF THE OPPOSITE SEX AND DOES NOT ENCOMPASS COHABITATION IN A ROOM OR SUITE."
- PARAGRAPH 4:** WHEREAS, THE RHA (RESIDENCE HALL ASSOCIATION) FULLY SUPPORTS A POLICY OF 24-HOUR WEEKEND VISITATION.
- PARAGRAPH 5:** WHEREAS, MOST SEC (SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE) INSTITUTIONS, INCLUDING VANDERBILT UNIVERSITY, THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA AND THE UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE ALREADY HAVE 24-HOUR WEEKEND VISITATION POLICIES.
- PARAGRAPH 6:** WHEREAS, EVEN TULANE UNIVERSITY HAS 24-HOUR WEEKEND VISITATION.
- PARAGRAPH 7:** THEREFORE, THE LSU STUDENT SENATE, WITH FULL SUPPORT OF THE RESIDENCE HALL ASSOCIATION, RECOMMENDS THAT CHANCELLOR JENKINS ALLOWS THE LSU DEPARTMENT OF RESIDENTIAL LIFE TO ADOPT A NEW POLICY OF 24-HOUR WEEKEND VISITATION IN UNIVERSITY RESIDENCE HALLS.

16 USE MIDDLETON LIBRARY DURING THE SEMESTER; AND

18 **PARAGRAPH 2:** WHEREAS, DURING MIDTERM AND FINAL EXAMINATIONS SIX
19 SEVEN THOUSAND STUDENTS USE MIDDLETON LIBRARY; AND

21 **PARAGRAPH 3:** WHEREAS, WITH THE REMOVAL OF THE SHELVES ON THE FIRST
22 FLOOR NEAR THE COMMUNITY COFFEE SHOP THERE IS NOW
23 EMPTY SPACE; AND

25 **PARAGRAPH 4:** WHEREAS, THIS SPACE CAN BE USED TO SATISFY THE DEMAND
26 FOR AN INCREASE IN STUDY AREAS IN THE MIDDLETON LIBRARY;

29 **PARAGRAPH 5:** WHEREAS, THIS EXPENDITURE WOULD COVER THE FOLLOWING

40 MAXIMUM OF FIVE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED EIGHTY SEVEN
41 DOLLARS AND TWENTY-FIVE CENTS (\$5,887.25) FROM THE
42 STUDENT GOVERNMENT SURPLUS ACCOUNT TO FUND THE
