GOALS AND PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

Discovery: Expand discovery through transformative research and creative activities addressing contemporary and enduring issues that shape the way we live in the world.

- Students will research the unknown with university faculty to gain experience and develop research skills necessary to acquiring an advance degree.
- Increase student's participation in research across the curriculum

• Students share research with peers and other professional groups at conferences

Learning: Enhance a faculty-led and student-centered learning environment that develops engaged citizens and enlightened leaders.

- Students perform research under the direction of faculty/professional researchers having the option to select their subject of interest or participate in the faculty's research.
- Students present research findings at a professional and/or academic conference.

- McNair participants are first-generation and low-income students who would be from an underrepresented population in graduate school across the US.
- Students are recruited from Southern University, University of Southeastern-Hammond, University of New Orleans, and all LSU campuses. Participants have been encouraged to attend LSU Graduate School and receive tuition waivers for two years. This philosophy stimulates cultural diversity at the under-graduate and graduate level

Engagement: Promote engagement of faculty, staff, and students in the transformation of communities.
